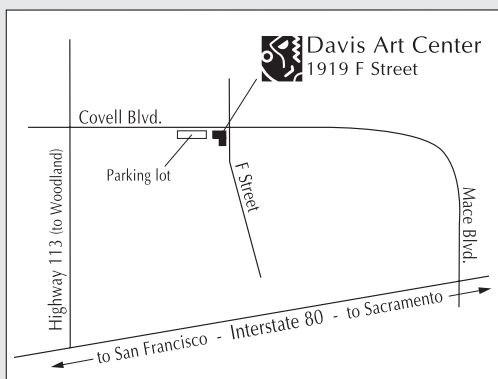

Although it is not necessary to be a member of the Davis Art Center in order to take classes, we do appreciate the support your membership provides. A membership form is included in this catalog for your convenience. The first price quoted for classes is the member price, followed by the non-member price. DAC instructors are independent contractors and determine their own fees, class size, content and style of instruction.

## REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

Online registration for summer classes for members begins March 12. Non-member registration and in-person, mail, fax and telephone registration begins March 19.

All registrations are considered confirmed upon completion. You will not receive further confirmation. Therefore, it is your responsibility to record all personal registration information to ensure attendance on the correct date and time. If a class for which you have registered is full, postponed or cancelled, you will be notified.

### WAITING LIST

Once the instructor's maximum enrollment is reached, names will be placed on a waiting list and students will be notified if an opening occurs. You cannot add to the wait list while registering online.

### CANCELLATIONS

We urge early registration for all workshops and classes. Our instructors need adequate time for preparation and purchase of materials. Minimum enrollment must be met at least one week prior to the first day of class or there is a possibility of cancellation. When enrollment is low, instructors reserve the right to cancel the class. We will make every effort to contact families when classes are cancelled.

### REFUND POLICY

If you are unable to attend a class, we will issue a full refund if you notify us a minimum of **two weeks** before the first class.

If notification of withdrawal is given after this time but **at least three business days** before class begins, you will be responsible for the materials fee, if any, and will receive a credit to be applied to future classes for **90% of the remaining amount.**

**Within three business days of the first class, registrations are considered final and no refunds will be given,** unless you are transferring to another class given by the same instructor. Exceptions to this policy may be granted only if there is a waiting list for the class dropped and we are able to fill your space, or in cases of documented family or medical emergency.

**Fees cannot be prorated due to planned absences, minor illnesses or vacation schedules.** No refunds are given due to failure to attend class.

If enrollment is insufficient and the instructor cancels a class, you may choose to have your fee refunded in full, transferred to another class, or posted to your household credit account.

### SCHOLARSHIPS

A limited number of scholarships for classes are available through the Davis Art Center Scholarship Fund. In addition, the Arthur C. Heehler Scholarship Fund provides scholarships for adult creative writing students at DAC. Awards will be based on merit and financial need. Residents of Davis and nearby areas are eligible. Applications at the DAC office are due at least three weeks before the start of the class desired. Please note: Scholarships can be given to the same family only once per year.

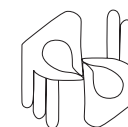
### PARTICIPATION POLICIES

## SUMMER 2010 "WEAVING WORKSHOPS" FOR CHILDREN (ADULTS WELCOME)

Introductory note to Summer Session weaving classes: Please note that the format used for summer weaving classes differs from the format used during the school year. Age levels and skill levels are combined, while ten hours of instruction are condensed into one week. Although each workshop will be a self-contained unit, students may take any number of them on a continuous or intermittent basis, depending on space availability. This is designed to accommodate family vacation schedules.

Students will work on equipment appropriate for their level of experience, ranging from the simplest frame and two harness table looms to four-harness floor looms and including inkle looms. Students and parents need to understand that the instructor will determine the appropriateness of the equipment. The intent is to provide as rewarding an experience as possible.

Examples of what weaving students produce are pillows, rugs, place mats, scarves, belts, blankets, runners, bags, wall hangings, shawls, bookmarks, friendship bracelets and key-chains.

No make-up classes will be scheduled, but instructor will try to provide make-up opportunity in case of illness. **SORRY – ABSOLUTELY NO MAKE-UPS FOR CLASSES MISSED DUE TO TRIPS. Please plan carefully.**

**A materials fee is included** in the weekly workshop fee (\$35 for 5-day workshops, \$28 for 4-day workshops). Enrollment for each workshop is strictly limited to 10.

There are two separate 5-day (Monday-Friday) workshop sessions offered (1-3 p.m. and 3:15-5:15 p.m.) each of the following four weeks: June 14-18, June 21-25, July 12-16, and July 26-30. There are two separate 4-day (Monday-Thursday) workshop sessions offered August 2-5 and August 9-12. A different workshop, "Lots of Knots", will be offered July 6-9.

There will be one "Open Studio B," Saturday weaving workshop for adults and experienced teens.
